a safety briefing, ready to read to the crew

How to pick a talk from ShieldSphere's library of 120, or generate one from your own policies or any topic you name - then tune it, schedule it, and deliver it to the crew.

USER GUIDE – FOR EVERYDAY USERS

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ShieldSphere's Toolbox Talks, part of the Training module, gives you the five-minute safety briefing three ways: pick one of 120 ready-written library talks, generate one from your own policy so it says what that policy says, or describe any hazard for a custom talk. Deliver it as a session and the attendance becomes training records.

1 What Toolbox Talks does

Toolbox Talks writes the five-minute safety briefing for you - grounded in your own policies, in plain language, ready to read to the crew before the shift.

There are three ways to get one:

1. **From the library** - 120 talks ShieldSphere ships, written and ready to deliver as they stand.
2. **From a policy** - turn one of your written programs into a talk that reflects what your policy actually says.
3. **From a topic** - describe any hazard or safety concern and get a custom talk written for it.

Either way, you get a structured briefing - an overview, why it matters, the key points - that you can tune to your company, schedule, download and deliver.

TOOLBOX TALKS IS NOW A TAB INSIDE TRAINING

It used to have its own sidebar entry. It now sits in the **Training** module, next to the records that delivering a talk produces. Old links and bookmarks still work - they forward to the right tab.

READ A GENERATED TALK BEFORE YOU DELIVER IT

Talks you **generate** are AI-written. Review, edit and adapt them to your worksite before reading them to employees - the AI does not know your floor the way you do. Library talks are different: they are written and reviewed in advance, and are meant to be delivered as they stand.

2 Words you'll see

TERM	WHAT IT MEANS
Toolbox talk	A short safety briefing delivered to a crew, usually before a shift or task.
Generate from policy	Producing a talk from one of your existing written programs.
Custom talk	A talk generated from a topic you describe, rather than a policy.
Generation rules	Optional company-wide instructions - length, tone, required reminders - applied to every new talk.
Schedule	Setting a date to deliver a talk, from the calendar icon on a generated talk.
Library talk	One of the 120 talks ShieldSphere ships, ready to deliver without generating anything.
Adopt	Taking a library talk into your own talks, so you can schedule and deliver it.
Presenter mode	The full-screen view for reading a talk to a crew, with the sign-in QR alongside.
Session	One delivery of a talk. Closing it writes the training records - see the Training Sessions guide.
Rotation	Settings that decide which talk ShieldSphere suggests next, and on which day.

3 The ShieldSphere library

Most weeks you do not need a talk written. You need a good one chosen, and you need it now.

ShieldSphere ships **120 talks across 15 categories**: general safety and culture, PPE, falls and working at height, electrical, machines and tools, forklifts and vehicles, chemicals and HazCom, confined spaces and atmospheres, fire and emergencies, ergonomics, environmental and seasonal, construction, warehousing and manufacturing, health and wellness, and a Canada set. The **30 most-used talks also have a Spanish version**.

The library. Browse by category, or search. Nothing to generate and nothing to review first.

Open a talk to read it, then **adopt** it to take a copy into your own talks, where you can schedule it, deliver it and export it like any other.

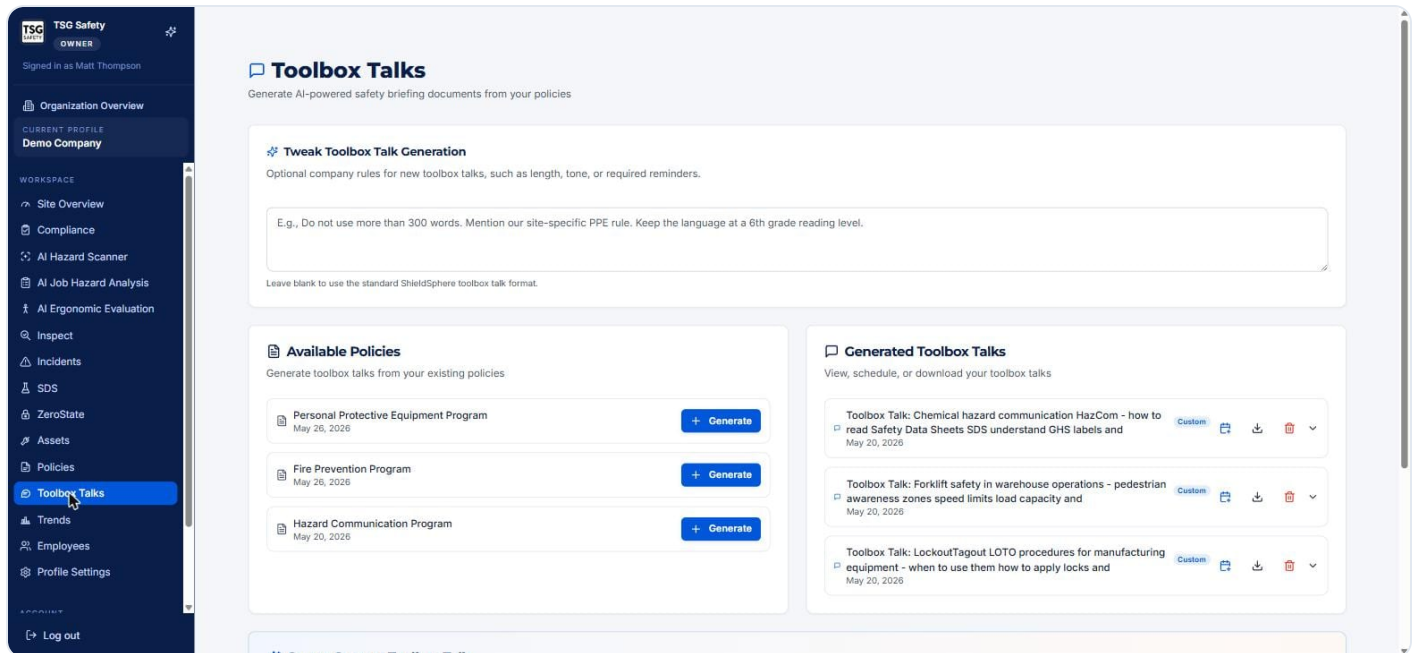
REACH FOR THE LIBRARY FIRST

A library talk costs nothing to use and needs no review before you read it. Generate a talk when you need something the library does not cover, or when you specifically want the briefing to mirror your own written policy.

4 Generate from a policy

The talk your crew hears and the policy in your binder should say the same thing. Generating from the policy guarantees it.

Training → Toolbox Talks → **Available Policies** → Generate

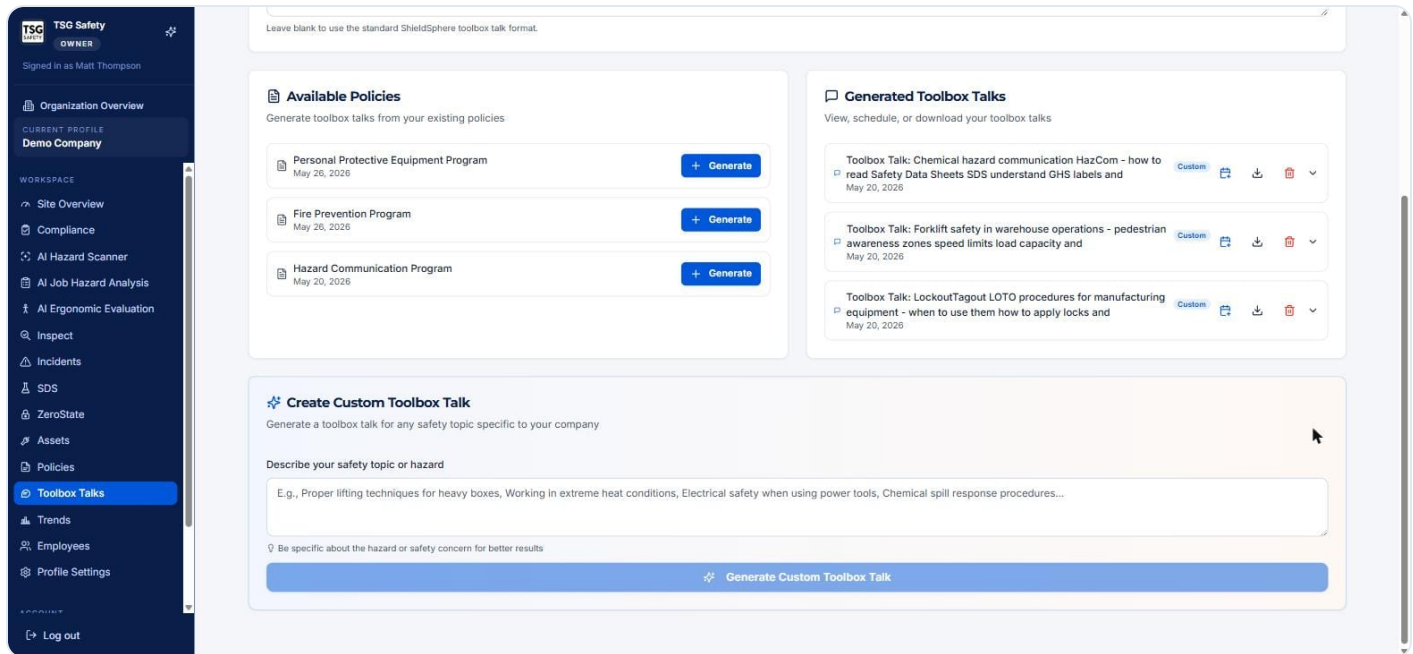


Toolbox Talks home. Your written programs sit under **Available Policies** on the left; the talks you have already made are under **Generated Toolbox Talks** on the right.

Find the program under **Available Policies** and click **Generate**. In a few seconds a talk built from that policy appears in the **Generated Toolbox Talks** list, ready to open, schedule or download.

5 Create a custom talk

When the topic is not one of your policies - a seasonal hazard, a one-off task - describe it and let the AI write it.



Create Custom Toolbox Talk. Describe the hazard - "working in extreme heat", "chemical spill response" - and click **Generate Custom Toolbox Talk**. The more specific the topic, the better the result.

6 Set your company rules

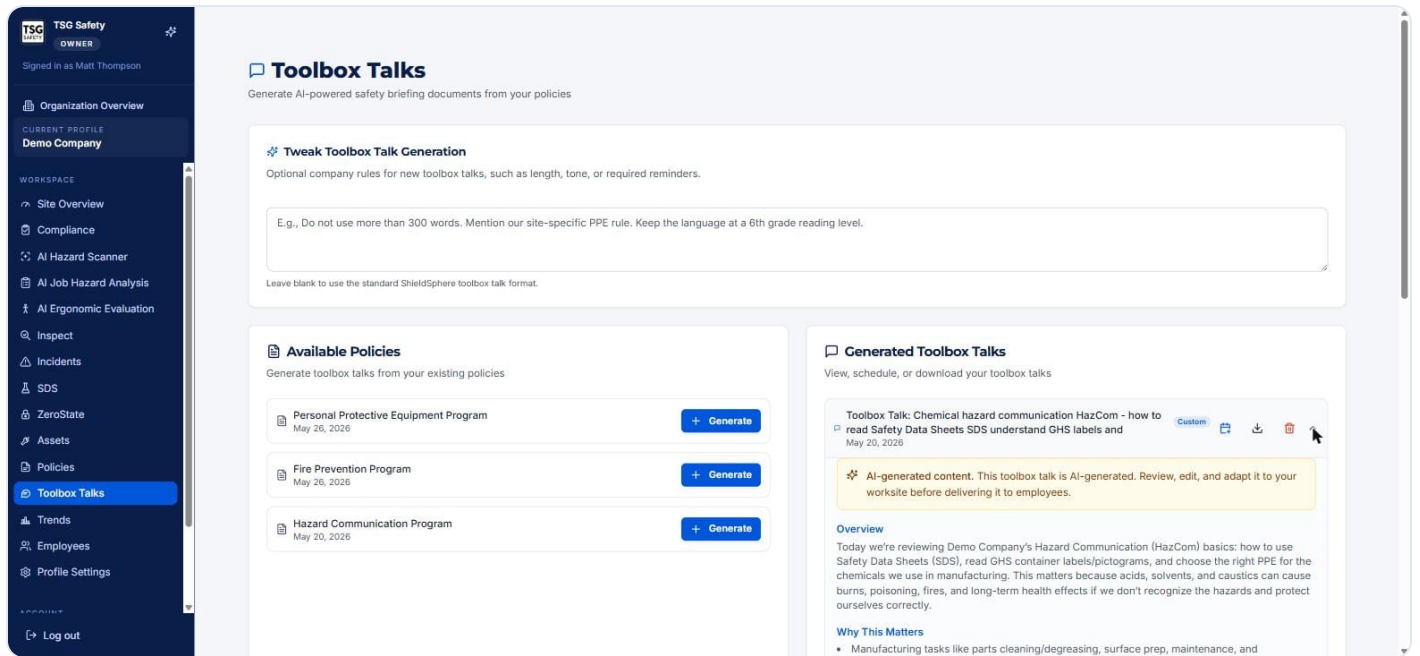
At the top of the module, **Tweak Toolbox Talk Generation** lets you set optional rules that apply to every new talk - a length cap, a reading level, a required reminder, a mention of a site-specific rule.

WRITE THE RULE ONCE

Something like "keep it under 300 words, at a 6th-grade reading level, and mention our hard-hat rule" set here shapes every talk you generate afterwards. Leave it blank to use the standard ShieldSphere format.

7 Deliver a talk

A generated talk is only useful once it reaches the crew. The controls on each one get it there.



Open a talk to read it. The chevron expands the talk in place - overview, why it matters, key points - with the AI-generated reminder at the top.

CONTROL

WHAT IT DOES

Chevron (expand)

Opens the talk's full text in place so you can read or review it.

Calendar

Schedules the talk for a delivery date.

Download

Saves the talk as a document to print or hand out.

Trash

Deletes the talk.

Presenter mode

Presenter mode puts the talk full screen in the order you actually read it - overview, why it matters, discussion points, safety reminders, and questions to ask the crew - with the session sign-in QR alongside, so people can sign in while you are still talking.

Getting the record

Reading a talk proves nothing on its own. The training record comes from running it as a **session**: create the session, show the QR, let the crew sign in, and close it. That writes a dated record for

everyone who attended, with their signature. This is covered in full in the **Training Sessions User Guide**.

DELIVERING IT WELL

Read it aloud, then make it a conversation - ask the crew where the hazard shows up on your floor. The session gives you the evidence; a talk that changes behaviour is the point.

8 What comes round next

The hardest part of a weekly talk is not writing it. It is deciding, every week, what this week's should be.

Rotation settings answer that for you. Set them once per location:

SETTING	WHAT IT CHANGES
Day of the week	The day the next talk is dated to. Set it to the day you actually hold them.
Industry	Weights the suggestions towards the talks that matter for your work.
Jurisdiction	United States, Canada or both - which decides whether the Canadian talks are included.

The card then shows what is **next in rotation**, along with anything flagged as a priority for your industry or a seasonal pick - heat illness in July, cold stress in January.

STRAIGHT FROM A HAZARD YOU FOUND

When a hazard turns up in an inspection or a hazard scan, you can go from it directly to a talk on that hazard and schedule it. It is the shortest honest route from "we found this" to "we briefed the crew on it".

9 Troubleshooting

SYMPTOM

CAUSE AND FIX

No policies to generate from

None have been created yet. Generate policies in the Policies module first, then return here.

The talk is too long or off-tone

Set a rule in **Tweak Toolbox Talk Generation** - length, reading level, tone - and generate again.

A custom talk missed the mark

Be more specific in the topic description - name the task, the hazard, and the setting.

I need a copy to hand out

Use the **download** icon on the talk.

The talk mentions something that is not true of our site

It is AI-generated - edit it before delivery. Never read a talk you have not reviewed.
